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## SHIP SIR GEORGE SEYMOUR OFF TILBURY PORT;

SUNDAY	August 8th/47	Moderate breezes and clear. Ship all ready for embarking the Pensioners. Wind light from the NW. Crew all onboard.
MONDAY	August 9th/47	Wind NW Fresh breezes and cloudy through out. Sent the Royal Yards up. Rigged the Flying Jibboom. Embarked 112 Men, Women and Children. Government Emigrants.
TU' DAY	August 10th/47	Wind SW. Fresh breezes and cloudy with rain at intervals. Embarked the remainder of the Government Pensioners with the Officers in Charge Including Major Gray's Family and Servant making altogether 264 Persons. Issued this days rations to all embarked. Five on the sick list of Emigrants.
WEDNESDAY	August 11th/47	Moderate breezes and clear through out. Crew employed making ready for sea etc. Told the Pensioners off into masses and appointed Cooks and other necessary arrangements. Eleven on the Sick List of Emigrants.
TH. DAY	August 12th/47	Wind SW. Moderate with fine weather. At Noon sailed from Gravesend. At 5p.m. came to Anchor at the Lower part of Sea Reach in 7 fathoms. Handed sails and set the watch. Fourteen Emigrants on the sick list. Ends fine clear weather.
FRIDAY	August 13th/47	Light winds and variable, At 8a.m. got underweigh and made sail. At noon light air. Came to anchor close to the Nore Light. This day contains 6 hours to commence the Sea Log. Seventeen Emigrants on the sick list this day. So ends this day.
